Get Ready for Winter Weather Hazards

Frigid temperatures, heavy snow, icy roads, strong winds, flooding and more can make winter particularly dangerous. Make sure you are prepared for hazardous weather this winter by checking out the National Weather Service’s Winter Safety website! Also, Syracuse University’s Health Services has put together a guide to [winter weather health precautions](#) that you should take a moment to review.

The University remains open and observes its schedules in most weather conditions, unless the determination is made by senior level campus leaders (in consultation with meteorologists and government officials) that conditions warrant cancellation of classes. In the event of class cancellation, dining halls and most campus services remain operational for residential students. In the event of extreme weather emergency conditions, instructions will be communicated to the University community.

- SU’s radio station WAER-FM 88.3 and other local radio and television station for University information.
